DELEGATES VOTE ON NEW CONSTITUTION

Delegates to this month's Annual Council Meeting in Blackpool will be voting on a new Constitution that changes the name of the Union and abolishes the role of the General Secretary.

The National Executive have proposed 10 notices of motion detailing the changes that will need to be made to the Constitution. Each motion specifies particular rules that are affected so the agenda needs to be read in conjunction with the new draft constitution.

"The Executive felt we needed to streamline the management of the Union," said National President George Dawson. "We have been able to operate successfully without a General Secretary now for a couple of years so we know this system does work."

Rule 1 of the new constitution changes the name of the Union from the Working Men's Club & Institute Limited to CIU Limited and is covered by the first motion on the agenda. It reflects the fact that in the 21st century clubs are no longer dominated by men in the same way as they were, and helps the Union to present itself as a modern organisation. It's estimated around 300 of our 1,800 clubs have a woman as Club Secretary and less than 10 remain as men-only clubs.

TEN MOTIONS

The ten motions on the agenda refer to the rule changes that will need to take place. Motion 2 covers all the places where the role of the General Secretary is mentioned in the old constitution while following the sale of Saltburn House to Hayes Working Men's Club see below - Motion 3 removes the phrase "facilitate the provision of convalescence" from the list of the Union's objectives as well as the requirement to spend money on convalescent facilities. Hayes WMC have indicated, however, that they will continue to offer convalescent facilities where rooms are available.

Other motions refer to the annual fee, which is now calculated at a rate per member rather than just on the size of a club's male membership; provision is made for a member of the Head Office staff to replace the General Secretary as Returning Officer at elections and the date when the Provisional Agenda for Blackpool is sent out changes from February 1 to February 15.

The Union's last Convalescent Centre, Saltburn House on the north Yorkshire coast, has been bought by one of our most successful clubs.

Hayes WMC will be running the building as an extension of their club in West London. As well as hotel-style accommodation with special rates for all CIU club members they are offering entertainment, meals and the usual facilities of a club and have already signed up more than 600 people in the town as members.

He joined the Committee in 1973 and in 1978 he became Club Treasurer, holding the post until last year.


"Ray was always willing to help in any way possible and will be sadly missed as part of the management," said Julie. "But the Committee and members hope he will now relax

Tony's citation reads:

"Tony Trotter has been granted the award for his diligent work in our clubs for 50 years where he has been responsible for raising tens of thousands of pounds for local, national and indeed CIU charities. "Examples of events run were rock and roll dances and one year he walked from home to Bedford and back – about 26 miles – to raise money for the CIU Chine appeal. Other recipients of monies raised have been sufferers from Down's Syndrome, Alzheimer's Disease, breast cancer and child cancer.

"Unwell local children have been given days at the seaside. Autistic children were given the experience of swimming with dolphins. Parents with sick children were given help with expenses to visit their children in Great Ormond Street, Kettering and Northampton

hospitals. The Air Ambulance and Marie Curie Appeal were also supported. "That is not an exhaustive list.

"Tony is a person who has never sought publicity for himself over decades of hard work for others, a truly selfless individual who epitomises all that is good in our movement."

Oh, give me your pity, I'm on the Committee which means from morn to night we attend and amend and contend and defend without a conclusion in sight.


We confirm and concur, we defend and demur and reverberate all our thoughts. We revise the Hgenda with frequent addenda, and consider a load of reports.

How Casual Worker Contracts differ from Zero Hour ones

Casual Worker Contracts are not the same as Zero Hour Contracts. For more information about Zero Hour Contracts, please refer to the article on that subject described in the January 2014 edition of the *Club Journal*.

The basic difference between Casual Worker Contracts and Zero Hour Contracts is that anyone operating under a Zero Hour Contract has employment status. This gives them employment rights as with other employed club staff. A Zero Hour Contract contains provisions which create an "on-call" arrangement between the club and its employee. It does not oblige the club to provide work for its employee, nor does it oblige the employee to accept the work offered.

Surprising as it may sound, one in ten of our over-65s in the UK is malnourished. Recent reports have concluded hunger and malnutrition is becoming quite a common problem for many here in the United Kingdom, and it still remains an issue for many poorer developing countries overseas.

According to a study by the National Association of Care Catering there are close to 3 million people who are malnourished in the UK and 350,000 have used food banks in the past year. Sadly, at least one third of those who are not getting enough to eat are elderly people living alone including one in 10 of those aged over 65.

The data collected for this research shows 93 per cent of those affected by malnutrition were found to be suffering from not only economic pressures but the steady rise in the cost of living. More than one third of councils in both England and Wales are subsidising food banks, but more needs to be done to stamp out hunger in the UK. In the meantime there are some ways we can all help to address hunger in our own local towns or rural communities.

If you have a few hours to spare maybe you can consider volunteering your time or putting together a fundraising event in your club, church or school to collect non-perishable, in-date food items to donate to the local food banks in your own area.

Those working under a Casual Worker Contract are not employees but are described as "workers" within UK employment legislation. A Casual Worker Contract does not give rise to a relationship of employer and employee. There is no mutuality of obligation whatsoever between the parties. This means that the club is not obliged to offer work, nor is the worker obliged to accept any offer of work made by the club.

Common Law Duties and Conduct

A "worker" will still owe the club the usual common law duties expected, which will include:

- Ensuring their conduct is not detrimental to the interests of the club.
- Ensuring services are carried out with reasonable care and skill to a standard reasonably expected by the club.
- Complying with the club's policies, procedures and practices
- Taking reasonable steps to ensure their own safety and the safety of others.
- Complying with all reasonable instructions and requests within the scope of the agreed services and duties.

Annual Holidays

"Workers" are entitled to 5.6 weeks' paid holiday per year (subject to a maximum of 28 days), including any public/bank holiday entitlement. Entitlement is calculated on a pro rata basis. The club must make an additional payment equivalent of the hourly fee for each hour worked as payment for annual leave accrued. This additional payment must be separately detailed on the Pay Notification, for clarity.

Sick Pay

"Workers" are entitled to Statutory Sick Pay (SSP) provided the worker meets the qualifying SSP conditions.

Giving notice

There is no requirement on either the "worker" or the club to give notice to end the agreement.

Although there is no formal requirement to give notice of termination of the agreement, both the "worker" and the club should agree to inform the other if either decides not to provide work for the other. If you are considering offering either Zero Hour Contracts or, Casual Worker Contracts to anyone, then please contact your Branch Secretary for more information.

Turn down the volume, grandad

A Catholic Club in Manchester, where the average age is over 70, has been warned for playing music too loud.

The club has been served with a statutory nuisance notice, which comes with a maximum fine of £20,000 because its regular three-piece band's repertoire of 60s hits are too loud for one of its neighbours, a new mother.

The complaint has come despite the club spending £25,000 on soundproofing. The local Tameside Council recently fitted a sound limiter, designed to cut music out when it exceeds a certain level but these devices can be ineffective if a window or doors are left open.

The club's Committee must comply with the legal notice issued under the Environmental Protection Act or face a hefty fine and a court appearance.

High flyers help high flyers

The team behind the King of Clubs have proved to be aces at fundraising by handing over a cheque for $\pounds10,000$ to for their local Air Ambulance.

Beechwood, Easterside & District Social Club in Middlesbrough raised the money with a year-long campaign of fundraising events including bungee jumps, a walk in the North York Moors, and a coast-to-coast cycle ride along the line of Hadrian's Wall.

"We decided to adopt a charity and spend a year raising funds to really make a difference," said Club Secretary Mick Smith."

This year the club has teamed up with radio station Magic FM to raise money for Cash for Kids, which helps disabled

and disadvantaged children. Among the ventures is a Two Ferries bike ride, which involves cycling from Middlesbrough to Hull, taking the ferry to Rotterdam, cycling to Amsterdam, sailing from there to Newcastle and back to Middlesbrough.

The club was voted King of Clubs in the 2013 Club Awards, organised by Club Mirror. This year the Union is again sponsoring the award for the Traditional Club of the Year, which was won jointly by two ClU clubs Bloxwich Memorial Club in the West Midlands, and North Ormesby WMC in Middlesbrough.

President makes Smart move to cut energy bills

National President George Dawson's club has become the latest to slash their heating bills with the help of National Account supplier Smart Energy.

The President asked Smart Energy to install their low watt heating panels at Arden Road WMC in Halifax, where he is Club Secretary, after reading in *Club Journal* how they had reduced clubs' winter fuel costs by up to 75 per cent – and he is delighted with the results.

You have to speculate to accumulate and that's what they've done at this club, which sits at the heart of its community on the edge of Doncaster.

The club recently spent £200,000 to make its concert room one of the smartest in the area and it's paid off with the club's Saturday night concerts being packed out and a waiting list for functions on Friday nights.

With several nearby pubs and clubs going under recently the club has emerged as the focal point in this former pit village.

"It's been very successful," said Club Secretary Alan "Taff" Jones. "On a Saturday night you can't get a seat in here after eight o'clock."

Back in 2007 the Committee anticipated the smoking ban by banning smoking in the concert room – though it was still allowed in the bar. They reasoned that this would mean the décor in the concert room would last longer and they could spend more money bringing it up

to a high standard. It now looks magnificent with the piece de resistance being the mirror behind the bar, which includes a crown and the club's name etched into it – so much so that it's now also a popular venue for weddings. Says Treasurer Geoff Smith, who makes up the other half of the "Smith and Jones" management team: "Members pay £100 deposit to hire the room. Then if there's no damage we give them £50 back.

"We started the smoking ban in here. We must have been one of the first clubs to have a non-smoking concert room. We allowed people to smoke in the bar but not in the concert room and the room has seen the benefit."

The full ban meant the club had to cater for smokers outside but fortunately there is a beer garden at the front of the club. It proved particularly popular during last year's hot summer and also made it easier for families with children, which the club are always keen to encourage as younger members are always needed.

The club are pretty keen to hold on to their older members as well and members raised \pounds 1,500 for a defibrillator for a club. Twelve members of the Committee and staff have also been trained in how to use the machines, which give the heart an electric shock to restart it. One recently did just that at a club in Bolton saving the life of an 86-year-old

snooker player in the process. Charity efforts in the past have also raised money for Help for Heroes, Marie Curie, local cancer charity Firefly and the Air Ambulance.

For the same reason the club also gets a lot of people coming in before race meetings nearby and Doncaster Rovers home matches. Those that don't go can use the services of the bookmaker's who rent space from the club. "It's the perfect arrangement," says Alan. "We can't lose."

Along with the Saturday evening concerts televised sport is a big draw, particularly on Sunday afternoons. With no Premier League teams in this part of Yorkshire there is a wide spread of teams supported with Manchester United v Liverpool probably being the busiest fixture. This is reflected in the various pictures and mirrors arranged around the bar though there is one section for Doncaster Rovers.

"It means there's always a lively atmosphere and plenty of banter," says Alan. "But we never have any trouble."

One framed newspaper cutting celebrates the early career of Sheffield Wednesday footballer Peter Swan, who was born in Armthorpe and made 19 successive appearances for England before being caught up in a betting scandal that probably cost him a place in the team that won the 1966 World Cup.

The club itself was founded in 1953, a year famous not just for the Stanley Matthews Cup Final but also for the Queen's Coronation year. Back then it was just a wooden shed in a farmer's field. But how far it's come.

A new era for Saltburn

Saltburn House, the Union's holiday and convalescent centre on the north Yorkshire coast has reopened after being bought by one of our most successful clubs, Hayes WMC in West London.

The move was sealed when Union President George Dawson and Vice-president John Tobin visited Saltburn and handed over the keys to Hayes Club President Jim Walker and Vice-President Ron Sturgess.

Saltburn House is now an extension of Hayes Club, which has spent £50,000 on alterations to the centre, creating a beer cellar and a bigger bar, which has now been opened up to non-residents and will be offering real ale as well as live entertainment at weekends.

Saltburn lost its last CIU club this year and more than 700 people in the town have already become new members of Hayes WMC.

"We've reopened it as a club so club members in the town can use it," said Club Secretary Bob Daybell. "Our Rules allow us to offer temporary membership to anyone who lives more than 25 miles from Hayes so anyone who is staying can become a temporary member." The club's commitment meant that they started work at Saltburn before Christmas even though contracts

weren't formally exchanged until last month. "We're also keen that we employ people who live in the town and that the people of Saltburn see it as part of their town." Former Manager Maxine Howes has returned as Manager as has award-winning gardener lan Harrison and Hayes hope to make 17 staff jobs permanent.

Hayes have reinstated Saltburn's old drawing room, and kept its games room and classroom facilities. It hopes that the Union's Education Schools will return and that its conference facilities will attract outside bodies. It will also be able to offer convalescence when rooms are available.

Group Account

The club have been helped in their refurbishment work by Joe Beard, their accounts manager who even travelled up from London to help out. Because they have two outlets Heineken now class them as a group account.

Some aspects of the old-style Saltburn House remain. The new team organised Christmas and New Year parties, and for the first time will be organising a St George's Day party. "We're happy to try anything, It's just a question of seeing what works and what doesn't," said Bob.

Christmas dinner at £30 a head also proved popular in their new carvery, which is successfully running Sunday lunches. The carvery includes a children's menu and well behaved children will be welcome as, says Bob: "Every child is a CIU member of the

future."

LORD BILSTON **CLUBMAN AND PARLIAMENTARIAN**

The Union is sad to hear of the death at 71 of a true friend, Lord beer. He joined the All-Party Bilston, the Secretary of the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Non-profit Making Clubs.

Hundreds of people packed the church and mourners lined the streets of Wolverhampton to pay tribute to Lord Bilston, who as Dennis Turner, was one of the city's MPs from 1987 to 2005 before joining the Lords. Lord Bilston was born in Bradley in the Bilston ward of Wolverhampton and lived there his entire life. He worked as a market trader and steelworker, and served as Secretary of a local club, Springvale Social Club. One of the youngest-ever councillors on Wolverhampton Council he also served on the West Midlands County Council before becoming MP for Wolverhampton South West in 1987.

While an MP he campaigned on issues of fair trade and education and famously introduced a Private Member's Bill seeking to make clear the correct amount of froth at the top of a pint of

Group in 1988 and became Acting Treasurer in 1992, Vice-Chairman in 1993 then Joint Chairman in 2001 when he took over from Lawrence Cunliffe. In 2004 he became the Group's Secretary when Lord Brooks of Tremorfa retired after serving as Secretary for 21 years since its formation in 1983.

After retiring from the Commons in 2005 he took the title of Lord Bilston and continued to serve clubs with the All-Party Group. **Union President George Dawson** said: "He will be very greatly

missed. He was a good friend of the Union and his death is a sad loss to us all."

Lord Bilston served as Clare Short's parliamentary aide until she resigned her Cabinet post in protest over the Iraq war. At his funeral she said: "I knew him for 40 years and all the stories everyone has told of his incredible friendliness, they are all true.

"Inside that were steely principles but he was such a loveable person and there aren't many like him."

Former Labour Leader Neil Kinnock described his Black Country accent as being like collapsing bricks and said: "His whole life was about helping people.

"He brought the very best mix of abilities that anyone would want from a democratic representative."

Lord Bilston married his wife Pat in 1976 and leaves a son, a daughter and a granddaughter.
