sky STRIKES NEW DEAL WITH CLUBS



Sky TV have agreed to a simpler and lower pricing deal for clubs.

The new agreement has been developed in partnership with the clubs' umbrella group CORCA, whose largest member is the CIU, and means prices start from as little as £100 per month and come with a simplified structure and packages better suited to meet clubs' needs.

"CORCA has been in regular dialogue with Sky to discuss the needs and concerns of members and to continue to press for a fee structure and service which better meets the needs of clubs throughout Great Britain," said Chairman Philip Smith. "This is an issue on which we have been active and the announcement of this new pricing structure is great news for all CIU-affiliated clubs."

Sky has two packages for clubs with prices still based on rateable value: the Sky Base package includes Sky Sports 1, Sky Sports 3 and Sky Sports News and news, music, variety and other sports channels. For comprehensive sports coverage, Sky Ultimate includes everything in the Sky Base package as well as Sky Sports 2, Sky Sports 4 and importantly ESPN – ensuring coverage of all televised Premier League matches and Champions League matches.



lain Holden, Managing Director of Sky Business, said: 'We are committed to giving our customers great value for money while helping them grow their businesses. Working with CORCA we have created a new agreement which creates a pricing structure more suited for clubs' needs.

"The year ahead will be the best ever for live sport on Sky with more football, cricket and rugby than ever before, all in HD, and more stunning 3D on Europe's leading 3D sports service. And, of course, Sky Sports becomes the new home of Formula1 from next season."  Sky and the Premier League are clamping down on clubs and pubs showing matches with foreign decoders after a High Court judgment found that clubs and pubs may infringe the Premier League's copyright when showing overseas broadcasts in their premises.

One pub landlord in Essex was ordered to pay more than £19,000 in fines and costs last month for showing matches via Sky Sports without a commercial viewing agreement, while one distributor of foreign boxes and cards, Euroview, has suspended trading.

As this issue went to press the High Court in London was due to hear Portsmouth pub landlord Karen Murphy's appeal against her conviction for using a Greek viewing card — which The European Court of Justice has ruled is not illegal to buy — but the League and Sky believe the QC Leisure ruling on the unauthorised screening of copyrighted material is the more significant.

A Crescent of Diamonds

CIU clubs are famous for their charity fundraising but can anyone beat Cullercoats Crescent Club on Tyneside?

The club, which overlooks the North Sea, has been raising money for the village's lifeboat station every year for more than 60 years, and this year it handed over a cheque for £1,800. The money was raised in two stages during the year – at a concert by The Wild Cats in the summer and at a series of events leading to the club's New Year's Day party.

Co-organiser Kathy Blackman can remember 60 years of the New Year's Day event and estimates that over the years the



club has raised more than £60,000 for the lifeboat station, which has been in the village since 1852.



the club at billiards and other games. Most memorably, perhaps, he dressed up in drag with another Committee member because at that time the club could not afford to pay for entertainment.


Committee create Mayhem!

Are you still gaining strength? Although the illness will be with me permanently I am stronger in myself and have learnt patience and acceptance.

Are you still a member of the clubs you belonged to previously? Yes, all five clubs are, fortunately, still going and I have kept up my membership and CIU cards.

Former General Secretary and Club Journal editor Kevin Smyth continues to recover from the massive stroke he suffered shortly after leaving office two years ago. Many of his friends in clubland have inquired how he is and he has written these notes in questionand-answer form:

Where have you visited? I have stayed twice at Saltburn House and been very impressed with the facilities. A keen student of the Union's history I have visited the four old CIU homes at Pegwell and Broadstairs in Kent, Grange in Cumbria and Langland in South Wales as well as Henry Solly's grave in Oxfordshire. Providing the soil has begun to warm up, early to mid-March is the time to plant early varieties of seed potatoes. Main varieties can be planted later in the month or in early April. Traditionally, potatoes are planted at a depth of six inches with the shoots or rose end facing upwards, 12 inches apart and with 24 inches between each row. If the ground is workable and the soil not too wet also plant out onion sets, shallots and garlic. An easy plant for beginners, garlic needs freedraining soil and should not be put in freshly manured ground. But don't use garlic bought in a supermarket. It may not be disease-free and might not grow in our climate.

Prick out veg seedlings sown in February into individual modules and start sowing a variety of vegetables - using a heated propagator if you have one - such as early cabbage, celery and lettuce.

Summer bedding plants can also be sown now including marigolds, pansies, busy lizzies, geraniums, petunias and nicotianas. Best germination can be obtained if they are kept at a temperature of 70 deg F (21 deg C). This is also a good time to prune shrub and bush roses to improve flowering, maintain

an attractive shape and to keep plants healthy. Use sharp secateurs to make a sloping cut away from the stem just above an outward facing bud. Healthy stems of shrub roses should be reduced by a quarter and bush roses by about half. Feed with rose fertiliser to prevent black snot.

It's not too soon to push a hoe cauliflower, sprouts, tomatoes, around to keep weeds down and it's a good time to start composting kitchen scraps but not cooked leftovers, they attract rats - and garden waste. It's easy to make a square compost bin using four pallets and strong wooden stakes to keep them upright. Once part filled, cover with an old carpet to retain warmth which will speed up the composting process.

Stewards Dave and Maureen Ford are at the heart of the operation and it's a mark of how the Committee regard their Stewards that a plaque in the bar lists all the club's stewards since it was founded. Dave keeps what is regarded as the best pint in the village – with the help of his cellar, which is housed in a separate building. Maureen provides food for all occasions and, says Martin, "will do anything for the club."

UNION AND MPs TALK ABOUT CLUBS' CONCERNS

Union officials have discussed many of (AMLD) and VAT on gaming machines the issues affecting clubs at a meeting with MPs in Westminster. Among the topics discussed with the Executive of the All-Party Group of MPs were:

Police Reform & Social Responsibility Act 2011

The Coalition is trying to extend Early Morning Restriction Orders to include the period from midnight to 3am, which would affect some of our clubs. Once again our clubs are being tarred with the same brush as noisy pubs and bars. The threat of a late night levy being imposed on all licensed premises, including clubs, operating between midnight and 6am remains. Ostensibly this is to pay for the extra policing and general mayhem caused by city centre bars and we have asked MPs to tell the Government how unfair this would be.

Members were also concerned about power being devolved to licensing authorities to set licensing fees.

Licensing Act 2003

The Home Office is consulting on relaxing the licensing requirements on regulated entertainment.

Machine Games Duty (MGD)

This gross profits tax will replace Amusement Machine Licence Duty emailed to cj@powdene.com

from 1st February 2013. The Union has succeeded in having Category B3A lottery machines exempted from MGD.

Phonographic Performance Ltd (PPL)

PPL has proposed a large increase in fees for clubs and other venues using recordings at events involving a DJ and/ or dancing. The Union has vigorously opposed the increase and PPL is reconsidering.

Annual Conference 2012

The Union advised the Group that this year's Annual Conference will be the 150th anniversary of the CIU and invited a member of the Group's Executive to attend.

Union President George Dawson, Vice-President John Tobin and the Union's Administrative Consultant Norman Pritchard-Woollett were among those to meet the All-Party Group. They were joined on this occasion by National Executive members Gordon Winn and John Harris.

This is a legal requirement which the FSA are unable to waive. If a club fails to submit its returns, it lays itself open to prosecution by the FSA enforcement section and risks a fine and even cancellation of its registration.

The club's worth £33!

The 220 members of a were former CIU club sold for £250,000 have finally received their share of what they hoped would be a sizeable windfall -- £33 each.

The North West Ward Working Men's Liberal Club in Leeds was sold in 2007 but in 2010, members learned that most of the cash from the sale had been swallowed up clearing the club's debts.

A £65,000 mortgage had to be paid back, £120,000 was owed to creditors, and there

"trading expenses" worth £21,000. Even then members miaht expected a reasonable sum but since then other costs, including £7,000 in solicitor's fees, £6,000 for the liquidator and £11,500 capital gains have left the total left in the pot at around £660 or £33 each.


The story is a powerful argument for any committee or club members tempted by hopes of a sizeable payout if the club closed down.

Success is in your grasp - just ask your members

We are all so full of fears for our clubs because of the undiminishing onslaught of ill-conceived and badly drafted legislation and red tape, coupled with the institutional aggression of HRMC towards us, that we often fail to exploit the positive that could bring security and even success to many of our clubs. Over the next few months

I hope to offer a series of BGOs for your consideration.

The overriding secret to success is – you've guessed it – the individual club member. Without the club member there is no club. Without the club there is no CIU. Without the CIU there is no protection for clubs from outside aggression and without clubs there is nowhere in the world like a working men's

club for its members to go.

How many times have members laid the blame on committees for a club's failings? Show me a club where this has not happened and I will permanently don a hard hat for protection against pigs landing!

A club committee is the steering group that guides the ship that is our club into calm waters; a club member is the fuel that is needed to power the ship. If club members do not power the ship, it has no means to protect itself should storms arise. The ship will be at the mercy of the elements and will capsize or run aground.

So what does the member need to do to fuel his or her club? Three things:

Use the club as a first port of call for the member and their family whenever they go out socially. Make sure they select from among themselves a full committee and let the committee know what they want to make the club how they want it to be.

So we would put it to you that if all the members were to physically support their club constructively, to ensure that the committee that is best suited to running the club is in place and to offer constructive criticisms to have the club how they want it to be, then the club itself will be on the road to success. It need not be a pipe dream. There is your first BGO.

The Prime Minister said on a recent visit to Newcastle that he would like to see a tougher approach on binge drinking, which the Government defines as having more than three pints. Good try Mr Cameron. Seems like you are on course to tackle any form of social intercourse outside the home. God save us from do-gooders. The percentage of those who abuse alcohol against those responsible drinkers is minimal. Of those abusers, many just drink at home thanks to the Government in its partnership with the supermarkets. There are more than enough laws in place to tackle alcohol abuse, but there is not the political will nor are there the financial resources to enforce them. Hasn't anyone explained to Mr Cameron that we only have one life - that there are no rehearsals? Please Mr Cameron, try thinking outside the box and the influence of the uninformed and embrace life in a positive and meaningful way. Having taken great strides to create an inclusive society you are showing real signs of fragmenting it and creating a series of underclasses. Just think!

Make yourself heard

Dear Sir,

Union President George Dawson's commitment that the CIU will continue to campaign for separate smoking rooms is very welcome. No one disputes that we have a voice in Parliament but it is a matter for debate as to how effective it is.

In a recent letter All-Party Group Chairman Greg Knight said many MPs are happy with the status quo and have said they will not attend any organised events to discuss amending the smoking ban. Several MPs are still saying they have not received ANY letters or petitions of protests from their constituents — this can only mean clubs have not written to them expressing their opposition to the ban.

If we lose this campaign the Department of Health will feel free to extend the ban to anywhere on the premises including car parks and alley ways — and smoking shelters. The media already suggest that the smoking ban has overwhelming support and a proposal to stop people smoking in their own cars, even with the windows open, was treated seriously by BBC Radio 5.

MPs will only put forward our concerns if someone asks them — it's that simple. We also need to be recognised and treated differently from High Street pubs, and not made to pay for extra policing despite our clubs having a fantastic record of no violence. Our identity as a major integral part of the community is slowly being erased.

At the end of this year public displays of tobacco products will be banned followed by plain packaging of cigarette packets. Recent news reports show how determined the World Health Organisation and ASH are in banning smoking everywhere, including public streets, children's playgrounds, all cars and if they can, in your own home. Don't think they wouldn't do it.

We must unite and prevent any more restrictions to the smoking ban, which can only result in massive club closures and even the CIU itself.
