He is also a very familiar face on CIU Conference Weekends and has not missed a single Annual Meeting in the past 62 years.

Indeed, he was one of the speakers at the 2015 Annual Meeting in Blackpool.

Heineken's SmartDispense system wins top award

The system, which reduces energy use by 20 per cent and water by 75 per cent, was recognised at the Edie Environment and Energy Awards, winning the Environment Product Innovation award.

SmartDispense was developed following £5 million of research, and has now been installed in over 3,000 on-trade outlets across the country – including many CIU clubs – cutting the environmental footprint and saving outlets around £2,000 a year on their bills.

The technology also reduces the frequency of cleaning, slashing the cost of cleaning products.

Simon Gray, Draught Dispense Development Coordinator, said: "SmartDispense not only cuts the overhead cost of every pint of beer and cider, but it also contributes towards every venues' bottom line, by reducing energy costs and the amount of water used."

TEAM LORD BILSTON SET FOR GRUELLING 24-HOUR HOSPICE CHARITY CHALLENGE

Brendon Turner, son of the late Lord Dennis Turner of Bilston, is preparing to take part in a gruelling 24-hour physical challenge in a bid to raise £15,000 for Compton Hospice which cared for his dad in the last stage of his life.

Team Lord Bilston – led by Brendon – will cycle 20 miles from Anglesea through pen-y-pass, ascending off road carrying bikes for a seven-mile mountain trek.

They will then cycle 25 miles to Lake Bala before swimming 800 metres. The gruelling challenge finishes with an 88-mile cycle to Wolverhampton.

This is the second challenge undertaken by Brendon and his friends since Lord

Bilston – a huge supporter of the CIU – died in February 2014, aged 71 after being cared for at Compton Hospice.

"I was truly touched and inspired by the work that Compton Hospice did on behalf of my family," said Brendon. "I wanted to organise an event that represented a real challenge like the one Compton staff and cancer patients face on a daily basis. I have been overwhelmed by the support I have from the people around me who are keen to help our local charity."

YORK BRANCH CELEBRATES 70 YEARS OF ITS GROUNDBREAKING QUIZ LEAGUE



York City Branch recently celebrated the 70th year of their Quiz League, recognised in the Guinness Book of Records as the oldest quiz league in Britain.

A meeting of the Education Section of York City Branch of the CIU, held on September 25th 1946, decided to form a quiz contest which attracted so many entries that a Quiz League was formed consisting of 20 teams for its inaugural season.

It is still going strong – and indeed, is recognised in the Guinness Book of Records as the oldest quiz league in Britain – and recently celebrated its 70th year with a special event hosted by Tramways WMC attended by several dignitaries, including the Right Honourable, the Lord Mayor of York, Councillor Sonja Crisp; the Sheriff of York, Mr Brian Smith and George Dawson CMD, President of the CIU.

Paul Monroe, Secretary of the Quiz League, began proceedings by welcoming the dignitaries, players and guests to the celebratory evening and a response was given by the Lord Mayor, who offered her, and the City's, congratulations to the League on its service to the community, its longevity and also her, and York City Council's, best wishes and hopes for a continued successful future.

Very bravely, the Lord Mayor's party had agreed to put forward a team to take part in the celebrations but added the codicil that they were not quizzers. Their opponents were drawn at random from the audience.

Sadly, it was not to be a successful venture for the Civic Party, as the Lord Mayor's team faced a team captained by a League stalwart, Tim Broadbent and comprised some of the best quizzers in the league, who ran out fairly comfortable winners.

The next match proved to be a closer encounter between randomly drawn quiz players who formed two teams and resulted in the team captained by Paul Smith, of Tramways A, managing to get home by 30 points to 28..

The final proved exciting, even for non-quizzers, and saw Tim Broadbent's team winning by a 31-30 margin over Paul Smith's team.

A raffle of donated prizes, including a 43-inch Smart TV, was held during the evening and shared between the League and the Lord Mayor's charities, with a total of £175 raised for good causes.

During the course of the evening, the CIU President, George Dawson CMD, presented a special award to Dougie Norton who has taken part in the Quiz league for an amazing 64 years.

A NEW LEASE OF LIFE FOR SALTBURN HOUSE

Since Hayes WMC bought Saltburn House on the picturesque North Yorkshire coast in 2014, the former CIU Convalescent Home has become an extremely popular destination as a club and holiday centre

Saltburn House, now owned by Hayes WMC, is situated on the North Yorkshire coast



Saltburn-by-the-Sea in North Yorkshire has several historical claims to fame. It was where Malcolm Campbell set his first landspeed world record in the Blue Bird car in 1922, while Rock icon David Coverdale of Deep Purple and Whitesnake was born and raised in the seaside resort.

From a CIU point of view though the town is best known for being the location of Saltburn House which served for many years as one of the Union's holiday and convalescent homes until it closed its doors for the last time in 2013.

The ownership of this handsome Victorian building was transferred to Hayes WMC the following year and Saltburn House is now positively flourishing all year round as a club and hotel.

The club is situated in extensive grounds with sea views and just a five-minute walk to the beach, the railway station, shops and restaurants. In addition, Whitby is close as is Redcar racecourse and Middlesborough FC.

"We spent a significant amount of money

on general refurbishment as the décor was a bit tired and needed an uplift but we've done our best to keep the character of the building," explains Bob Daybell, Club Secretary of Hayes WMC.

"Business has been very encouraging so far. The hard bit was always going to be getting local people used to using it as a club as it was for residents only when it was a CIU convalescent home. We put in a proper bar and beer cellar and remodelled the interior and that helped."

"We've signed up loads of members from the area but we've restructured the membership in a particular way where they're not full members of Hayes WMC and so don't have any voting rights. They're interested in using it as a local facility. But, of course, any CIU member can go there and use it."

"Running Saltburn House is not as straightforward as running a Working Men's Club as you've got cooks and cleaners, etc to think about as well as bar staff. The new managers – Andy and Anne Mitchell – are

doing a great job since they came in at the beginning of the year and everything is going in the right direction. I spend a few days up there every month but obviously my main focus is on the London club."

He continues: "Saltburn-by-the-Sea is a nice Victorian town in a lovely part of the world and Saltburn House is a beautiful building so we'd really like to encourage more CIU clubs to use it."

"It works really well for coach trips as it's very reasonable in terms of accommodation, food and drink and there's regular entertainment laid on. The bar prices are the same as in Hayes WMC so Saltburn House is the cheapest place to drink in the town."

"There's also plenty to see in the local area and the clubs who have come up for long weekends or longer stays have really enjoyed themselves and many of them are already planning a return trip!"

"We bought Saltburn House as an investment for the club and it's always going to have a sell-on value but it's great that we could save a local facility and keep it as

somewhere that CIU clubs and their members can use."

Managers Andy and Ann Mitchell have a strong club management background having spent five and a half years at Great Ayton WMC and three and a half years at Ormesby Club & Institute.

"We loved our previous jobs but as luck would have it we saw a recruitment ad for Saltburn House in the *Club Journal* and jumped at the chance," explains Andy. "I'm originally from Brotton which is just down the road and I know all about the club as my mum was a housekeeper in here in the 1980s.

"It's a great club and the members and guests love it. There are 27 rooms in total as well as a bar, function rooms, kitchens and a beer garden which catches the sun for most of the day. Our prices are low – £2 for a pint of John Smith's Magnet, £2.50 for a pint of Theakston's and £2.50 for a pint of Foster's."

The club certainly attracts a wide range of customers. There is a caravan park just down the road and their members use the club as their clubhouse. In addition there are locals, holidaymakers and CIU members who are all drawn to this beautiful part of the country and the friendly welcome offered by Saltburn House.

Food is also a big part of the club offer. "The introduction of a Sunday carvery has proved a roaring success," says Andy. "Fish and Chips Night on a Friday is also popular. All our food is fresh and cooked on the premises."

Club Journal visited on a weekend and

business was extremely brisk by Friday afternoon and got busier and busier until full for the Middlesbrough game that the club was showing on Sky that evening. The club has both Sky and BT Sport and is expecting some great turnouts for England's games during Euro 2016.

Post game, the club put on a karaoke session and a new stream of customers arrived to take part in this regular Friday night entertainment.

The club has its first wedding booking in September and has also been approached to be involved in this summer's Saltburn Food Festival, a huge event which attracts 15,000 people to the town each year.

It would seem that Hayes WMC made a very canny investment when they bought Saltburn House.

Would it be possible to give my club some tips on improving our wine offer to our members?

Paul Waller, Director of Third Party Brands at Crown Cellars (the specialist wine and spirits division of CIU Preferred Supplier Carlsberg UK), responds:

We have just launched our first Future of On-Trade Wine report. Conducted with over 1,000 wine consumers and 500 on-trade outlets, country-wide, the aim of the research is to uncover whether the on-trade is meeting customer expectations when it comes to wine, what is being done well and what areas can be improved upon.

Overwhelmingly the research has revealed that there are two very different groups of customers who have very different attitudes towards wine.

These two groups are differentiated by generations: Millennials, or those born in the 80s – 00s and the rest.

Fundamentally they would both like more choice and help with navigating wine lists. Both groups would like to feel inspired and enthused to try new wines and underpinning all of this is a desire for quality, both in terms of the wine itself and the overall experience.

How these needs are met, however, needs to be tailored in order to recruit millennials in to wine and engage and retain those over 30.

Millennials need to be inspired with a strong visual display in order to compete with other categories such as craft beers and ciders and would like to see simple, engaging descriptors on the wine list.

Currently they don't feel that there is enough guidance around taste and are being discouraged from exploring the category and diversifying.

In contrast, over 30s feel more confident in their wine choices but they appreciate

wine and food matching recommendations and are more likely to trade-up if encouraged to do so.

Overall, the research highlights that the trade has a more positive view of its wine offer than customers do. The biggest disparities are around range (countries and grape varieties), staff advice, temperature of wine and presentation.

Wine in the on-trade has developed and evolved significantly in the last decade, but it is clear that there is still some way to go to catch up with other drinks categories and with customer expectations.

When you consider that 41 per cent of wet-led premises still don't have a wine list, and 28 per cent of on-trade venues don't think that wine training is important, there is still work to be done.

We are looking forward to using the research in our report along with our experience and knowledge of wine trends to better advise and educate the trade.

Key points to take on board when considering your club's wine offer

- 39 per cent of customers feel that their wine is not served cold enough

- Wine awards are underutilised in the on-

trade. Medals are a key influencer of decision in the off-trade and this can easily be replicated in the on-trade by highlighting medals on the menu or on chalk boards

- A clear wine list with simple descriptions and staff training are essential to drive wine sales
- Customers want to see a good range of popular grape varieties at different price points that reflect what they are drinking at home

- The top three red varietals are Merlot, Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon. The top three white varietals are Chardonnay, Pinot Grigio and Sauvignon Blanc

- Offering a tiered range of the most popular grape varieties at different price points will help staff to encourage customers to trade up

- An eye-catching back-bar display, use of chalk boards (perhaps offering a 'Wine of the Month') and prominent wine lists can increase wine sales.



Last year saw nearly 2,000 members attending the event as they raised £3,500 for the CIU's Education Programme.

Lords Committee to examine the Licensing Act 2003

The House of Lords has appointed a Select Committee to consider the Licensing Act 2003.

The 12-strong Committee, which was appointed on May 25, 2016, includes Lord Smith of Hindhead CBE, the Chairman of the Committee of Registered Clubs Associations (CORCA) who is also the Chief Executive of the Association of Conservative Clubs (ACC).

The Committee has been appointed with a reporting deadline of March 31, 2017.

Club Management course pilot taking place in July

The Education Working Group continues to develop a new qualification in Club Management that should be rolled out before the end of the year.

Workbook and Module 1 covers 'Law & Regulations', with Workbook and Module 2 looking at 'Management, Finance & Administration'.

Following an initial training pilot scheme held in Wirral in February, a second pilot is taking place in Coventry this month.

SPOTLIGHT ON... GEORGE SMITH

Club Journal hears from NEC Member and Durham Branch Secretary George Smith about his life as a clubman and why he believes attracting younger members is crucial for clubs

Q: How did you become involved with clubs and the CIU?

I first experienced club life when, in 1965, I joined my parent club, the South Hylton WMC on the outskirts of Sunderland, of which I am now a life member. The Secretary at that time was Mr Jimmy Spencer. Shortly after that I was introduced to the Pennywell Comrades WMC by my father who was one of the founder members of the club.

In January 1977 I was made a member of the Billingham Trade Union Social Club on Teesside. In 1979 I was elected to the club committee; in 1991 I was elected as Chairman and in 1994 I was then elected to Secretary of the club, the position I hold to this day.

I was elected to the Durham Branch in 2003 and was Divisional Representative for the 'No. 6 Division' with a total of 23 clubs at that time.

After the upheaval within the Durham Branch in 2012/13, which somewhat fragmented the Branch in many ways, I was elected to the position of Branch Secretary on April 25, 2014.

I, along with the backing of the Branch Executive, the Branch Staff, Amy McKenna and Leesa Bradley, and the National Executive, have worked hard to keep our clubs together, and to prove to them that we are here to help them in any way we can: keeping them up to date with all old and new legislation, the everyday running of our clubs and to help them with their domestic problems.

This has proved to be highly successful and the clubs who found themselves caught up in the upheaval of 2012/13 and drifting away from the Durham Branch have realised that we are there to help them, and they are showing confidence back in the Branch.

We have returned to the happy family we were in previous years, or as one clubman commented: "It has been like the rising of the phoenix."

We now find that we have an extra 10 clubs in the Branch due to the sad closure of the Cleveland Branch and they have been welcomed to the Branch and are now participating in the Branch Divisions and special meetings.

Unfortunately over the years we have witnessed the characters of our clubs whittled away, those members who could sit and tell our younger members tales of years gone by. Unfortunately we are not recruiting enough of

the younger element of our communities to replace these characters.

It would be good to see more of these young people take more interest in our clubs and restore the enthusiasm so that in the future they too can pass on the stories of what happened in their younger days. We need these young people to help run our clubs and keep them thriving for another 150 years and more.

Q: How are Durham clubs generally faring at the moment?

The Durham clubs are holding their own. Midweek we are finding it a little slack with the close season on the football not helping.

Q: If David Cameron offered you three wishes on behalf of clubs, what would they be?

I would wish that the Prime Minister could influence our local councils to sing from the same hymn sheet. It seems that sometimes there are not two of them working from the same legislation.

My second wish would be for the Prime Minister and his colleagues to listen to our dilemma and introduce legislation to allow us to compete with supermarket pricing.

My third wish would be to allow our clubs to reintroduce a separate smoking room; the smoking ban has been the downfall of our clubs within the CIU and other societies.

Q: Are there any particular areas of modern life which you see as having a knock-on effect to clubs?

The largest knock-on effect to our clubs is the near disappearance of young people. When I was 18 years old one of your birthday presents off your father was a Club Membership Card; now it seems the interest is diminishing.

Q: What is your key aspiration for clubs in the year ahead?

I must reiterate the point of our young

members in the community. I would like to encourage them to visit our clubs to realise what they are missing out on.

Q: What do you say to the doom-mongers out there?

The doom-mongers are among the public that don't want to sample club life. I would like to say to them, come and try it, then comment – give it a chance.

Q: What are the most positive signs you've seen in the club sector in the past three years?

The obvious signs over the last three years are the improvement of the television companies' deals which have been introduced to our clubs. Also the breweries have realised that we should be working together, and they have introduced more help and greatly improved deals.

Q: If you could award an OCE (Order of the Club Empire) who would it be to and why?

My OCE Award would go to Mr Kevin Smyth, the former General Secretary of the Union, whose Union life was cut short by illness. We still see Kevin at our conference weekends and he still gives us valuable help when needed. The gentleman inspires us all – here's wishing you a complete recovery Kevin, and thank you!

Q: Who has been the biggest influence in your club life?

The biggest influence in my club life has been, apart from the aforementioned gentleman, Mr Jack Amos, or, 'The Jack of Clubs' as he was known in the North East, for the running of the charity of the same name for countless years. Jack was a former Durham Branch Secretary and also a member of the NEC. Jack was awarded the MBE in the Queens Honours List.

The Government's pledge in this year's Queen's speech was to ensure insurance would be made readily available to the potential owners and users of driverless cars, making this an encouraging sign of the changes forecasted.

An expert has estimated that driverless vehicle technology could be worth as much as £51 billion a year to the UK due to fewer accidents, improved

productivity and increased trade.

Companies such as Google, Ford and Uber are all championing the driverless car technology. However, governments and industry must work together not only to better educate and inform the public about driverless car technology but to make sure they are developing and producing the products people would want to purchase.

According to a survey by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, 55 per cent of the 200 people surveyed said they were unlikely to want to be a passenger of a driverless car, with 40 per cent saying they were very unlikely to want to be a passenger. Only 21 per cent of the people surveyed said they would be happy to ride in a driverless vehicle.

As the UK hopes to become a world leader of the driverless vehicle technology, projects such as the £8 million GATEway Research program by Greenwich Automated Transport Authority will help to overcome the technical, legal and societal challenges of implementing driverless vehicles.


