The stage is well and truly set for 2018 Conference Weekend



This year's CIU Annual Meeting will take place at the Globe Theatre, part of the Blackpool Pleasure Beach, the amusement park and conference centre.

The 900-capacity theatre will host the Annual Meeting on the morning of Saturday, April 14, which will include a welcome from The Worshipful the Mayor of Blackpool, Councillor Ian Coleman as well as an address from the keynote speaker Paul Maynard, the MP for Blackpool North & Cleveleys.

An official agenda for the Meeting will be published in the April issue of *Club Journal*.

The Beer & Trades Exhibition is the other key activity taking place during Blackpool 2018 and this, the 27th edition of the trade show, will be held over two days in the Paradise Room of the Blackpool Pleasure Beach – Friday, April 13 and Saturday, April 14.

The show aims to give club members all the information they need to boost their club's bottom line with advice available on all

aspects of club business from a host of trusted suppliers.

The Union's Preferred Supplier of gaming machines, Dransfields, will again be a major exhibitor at the show, alongside fellow Preferred Suppliers Heineken UK and Aon UK.

Each delegate will receive a set of complimentary drinks tokens on entry and there will be plenty of opportunities to win prizes on both days with raffles and bingo sessions taking place at regular intervals.

"The feedback we've had on the trade shows over the past three years has been overwhelmingly positive," said CIU Vice-President John Tobin.

"We've now expanded the event to two days so that those delegates who can only go to Blackpool on the Saturday will not miss out on experiencing the trade show.

"As usual we have a full range of exhibitors who will share their particular areas of expertise in order to help our clubs boost their revenues."

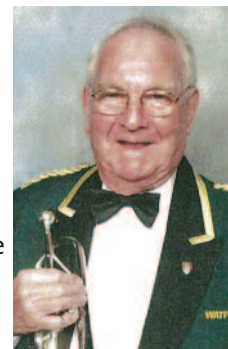

OBITUARY

Jack Johnson

Former Union General Secretary Jack Johnson, who has died at the age of 90, will always have a special place in the history of the CIU (writes Kevin Smyth).



Jack commenced his career shortly after the Second World War in the Royal Navy and was elected as Durham Branch Secretary in 1965 (coming back home so to speak). He had been a Club Secretary in Chester le Street.

Jack was elected to the National Executive in January 1967 and was a member of the Finance Committee until successfully standing for election as General Secretary in 1982.

He also served as a Union Lecturer for about 30 years, travelling all over Britain to lend his expertise to clubs.

Jack retired in 1992 at the age of 65 and could be proud of the many millions of pounds he saved for clubs through his determined stand against suggested price rises by the Performing Rights Society (PRS).

Always a keen trumpet player, Jack was still playing in many bands until quite recently.

His calm manner won him many friends. He lived for over 30 years in Harpenden with his wife Sylvia, who died earlier in 2017.

A genuinely nice man, he will long be remembered by many as a great General Secretary and friend. He leaves a daughter Helen and son-in-law David.

BT Sport and Sky sign new deal for Premier League rights

BT Sport and Sky Sports have signed new deals to show Premier League football from 2019-2022.

Sky Sports have won the rights to four packages – a total of 128 matches – while BT Sport have secured one package comprising 32 games.

When the deal comes into force in 2019, Sky will have 32 matches on Saturdays at 5.30pm; 24 matches on Sundays at 2pm; eight matches on Saturdays at 7.45pm; 32 matches on Sundays at 6.30pm; 24 matches on Mondays at 8pm or Fridays at 7.30pm/8pm.

BT Sport will show 32 matches on Saturdays in the 12.30pm slot.

Two further rights packages are also up for grabs which account for 20 matches from one Bank Holiday and one midweek fixture programme and 20 matches from two midweek fixture programmes.

Formula 1 British Grand Prix to be shown live on Channel 4

The British Grand Prix is going to be one of 10 Formula 1 events broadcast live on Channel 4 in 2018.

Channel 4 and Sky Sports will share the live coverage of the 2018 season with the opening event, the Australian Grand Prix, exclusively live on Sky.

The races in Bahrain, Azerbaijan, Monaco, Austria, Britain, Belgium, Singapore, Japan, USA and Abu Dhabi will be shown live on Channel 4.

Channel 4 will show delayed highlights of the 11 races it is not broadcasting live.

This is the final year of Channel 4's Formula 1 broadcast deal with the championship to be shown exclusively live on Sky next season.

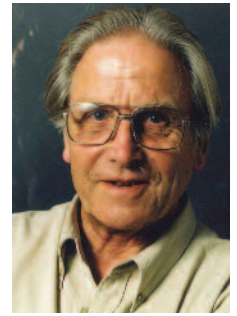

LINDLEY LIBERAL CLUB, HUDDERSFIELD

Lindley Liberal Club in Huddersfield has been at the heart of the local community since it was established back in 1887 and continues to be a thriving club with an array of activities taking place

Lindley Liberal Club in Huddersfield has been in existence since 1887 and the magnificent Victorian building remains at the centre of its community to this day, with over 2,000 members enjoying access to a wealth of sporting and cultural activities seven days a week.

“We always have plenty going on throughout the week to ensure the club is always busy in the evenings,” says Club Secretary Dawn Fawcett. “One of the mainstays of the club is our bowling section and we’re very proud to have some of the best facilities in Huddersfield. We have a separate bowling pavilion with its own kitchen and a fantastic green so that gets a lot of people involved in the club.”

But it’s not just the bowling green which has garnered renown in the area, the club’s Snooker Room is also a first-class facility with two full-size tables ensuring the snooker and billiards sections also flourish.

In addition, the club runs a cricket team,

dominoes team, stamp club, chess club, operatic society and the Chimes club, an organisation for senior citizens offering entertainment, trips and fellowship.

“We find that social media sites are a great way to get the message out about what the club has to offer”

“We have live entertainment every Saturday in the Concert Room,” says Dawn. “We tend to have duos and bands rather than single artists. We also have regular comedy nights, two bingo sessions a week, prize draws and quiz nights.”

The club also has a fully equipped kitchen – as well as a five-star hygiene rating – and puts on special dinners throughout the year, including, most recently a three-course

candlelit St Valentine’s dinner.

“Our dinners are always over-subscribed which is a great tribute to the high standard of our catering,” says Dawn.

Helping charity is also an important part of the club’s ethos and local charities can use the club’s facilities for meetings for free. The members also participate in fundraising throughout the year and have raised many thousands for good causes over the years

One local charity which has benefited is the Kirkwood Hospice. Last year saw the club hold a special snooker exhibition in memory of professional snooker player Paul Hunter who sadly passed away in 2006.

The event, which was staged in May 2017 and featured 2005 World Champion Shaun Murphy and attended by friends and family of Paul, raised a staggering £3,000 for the Hospice where Paul spent his final days.

Among its many other charity initiatives, the club has also installed a community defibrillator outside the club and offers regular free training session on how to use it

to members of the public.

In terms of marketing itself, the club is very active on social media with regular updates for members via twitter and Facebook and the club's own website. The latter is a great source of information on the club and has a section specifically geared toward non-members, giving them details on how to join the club.

"We've found that social media is an excellent way of getting the message out about what the club has to offer as well as the specific events we have coming up," says Dawn.

"Non-members can go on the website and get a flavour of what the club is all about as well as download a membership application.

"Some people still have that perception about members' club being old-fashioned but once they come through the doors they realise that's not the case and that it's a great place to be whatever your age or interests happen to be."

The club has successfully brought more young people into the fold through regular family-friendly events including the annual pantomime and Halloween and Christmas kids parties.

"It's a great way to introduce young people to the club and get them involved at an early age," says Dawn. "It certainly seems to be working.

"We've just refurbished the Committee Room upstairs and it looks really modern now. It's one of the rooms that we offer out for private functions. We also have disabled toilets and access and recently refurbished the gents toilets to make them into a

'wetroom'. As for the future, we're in the process of getting in quotes to refurbish the Concert Room and Lounge so we're determined to ensure that the club remains up to date.

"The private function side is doing very well – things like christenings, children's parties and funerals – and you often find that people will come along to a function here for the first time and then enquire about becoming a member."

Dawn pays tribute to the club's stewarding team, the brother/sister combination of Daniel and Sarah Bousefield, who run the bar operation extremely efficiently.

"They're a great team and bring plenty of energy and ideas to the table and really support the Committee in driving the club forward," says Dawn. "Cask ale is one of the

big sellers at the bar and our prices across the board are very reasonable. We're very busy at weekend and offer live sport through a subscription to BT Sport. The Premier League and European games generate plenty of interest and we always make sure that members know which matches we're showing.

"As a Committee we're really pleased with how well the club is doing," says Dawn.

"The club has long been part of the fabric of the local community and we intend to ensure that always remains the case."

LEGAL SPOTLIGHT: DEFAMATION

Following a recent flurry of claims threatening defamation against clubs CIU Legal Consultant Allyn Walton looks at how you can avoid this extremely serious business

As the Union's Legal Consultant I have been asked to write this article. Defamation is serious business. Though still generally regarded as a rich man's game it seems like it's filtering down into social clubs.

It's all a bit odd especially since the 2013 Defamation Act was meant to make things more difficult for claimants. Nowadays a claimant has to prove Serious Harm to their reputation just to get a claim off the ground. Also bear in mind the law gives Associations communicating between members a thing called Qualified Privilege. Your club is an association and has that defence available to it, including use of Notice Boards. But remember only use them when you HAVE TO and when reporting on Club Business.

So what on earth is there to worry about? Well, plenty as a matter of fact because the 2013 Act removed a lot of the common law cases which helped guide lawyers. Now everyone feels a bit lost and can't predict what might happen. But rest assured and read on, whenever you feel the need to communicate information to your members using a notice board or otherwise, follow these simple guidelines.

Truth: It is a complete defence to a claim in libel or slander if the defendant can show that the allegations they have published are substantially true.

Therefore Step 1: Stick to the truth, yes? Well not quite! This is because the burden rests on the Club to prove that the allegations were true, rather than for the claimant to show that they were false. By the way, the UK is the only country in the world to do this, reversing the burden of proving truth away from the claimant to the publisher! The solution?

Step 1: Stick only to what you are able to prove is true.

Let's put some flesh on the bones here. If you have expelled a member for allegedly bringing the club into disrepute, then say that in the Notice Board ONLY if you have investigated the allegation, determined whether it's true or not and had a vote confirming it. DON'T mention the basis of the allegation if for example the member didn't turn up to your disciplinary meetings, because that usually

means you have ASSUMED he or she must be guilty. According to libel law it doesn't matter whether you are right or wrong to make that assumption, it's still libellous!

To get around this maybe think about **Step 2:**

Honest Opinion: It is a defence to a defamation claim if the club can show that what they published was a statement of opinion.

So what does this mean? Very simply it means you CAN make some assumptions providing they're REASONABLE and so long as the statement complained of indicates the basis of that opinion; and that an honest person could have held the opinion based on any fact which existed at the time the statement was made.

However, be careful, this defence is defeated if the claimant can show that the defendant did not actually hold the opinion and one of the best ways a claimant can do that is to show malice, which also by the way defeats Qualified Privilege.

Step 3 then is...yes you'd guessed it...

Avoid Being Malicious: In other words don't say something just because you think someone deserves punishment or if you believe they have been malicious in their conduct towards you. Think about the club first and keep the moral high ground. I call this 'keeping the halo' and I'm sure you know exactly what I mean by that!

Anything else you might ask? Well yes there

are a few things, not so much steps as additional thoughts:

- Social media...NEVER...repeat endlessly, post anything about the situation on Facebook or any other Internet site. This is because you lose the status of Qualified Privileged as you are then talking to the whole world, not just your club members! Also be aware that Libel actions on the Internet have their own rules.
- DON'T try and be CLEVER. For example you might think avoiding actually naming someone will help you avoid libel...WRONG. Did I tell you about the guy in the White House who is going to start

WWIII in North Korea! No names mentioned there but I bet you know exactly who I mean!

- Avoid INNUENDO at all costs. OK, so you could put together a true report you can prove, and then go further by setting out your grounds for your honest opinion in the truth of your conclusions, satisfying the reasonableness test...only to then go and spoil it all by adding a quote from the Club Rules about the definition of fraud.

Get it? Well if you don't then for goodness sake... Seek advice. I can be contacted through Head Office at any time.

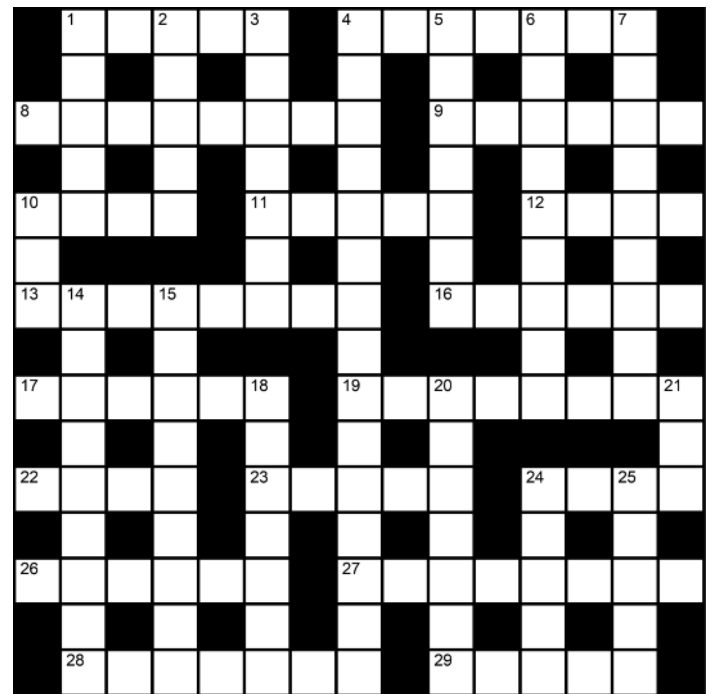
