## BT Sport and Sky Sports reveal club pricing for 2018/19 season



Manchester City will kick off their Premier League title defence against Arsenal on the weekend of August 11/12

BT Sport and Sky Sports have revealed their club pricing structure for the 2018/19 season.

BT Sport, who will be showing 42 live Premier League matches, as well as live action from the FA Cup and exclusive live coverage of the UEFA Champions League and UEFA Europa League, has announced a 4.9% price increase.

The broadcaster is also moving to a system based on 2017 rateable values (RV) rather than the 2010 RV as was the case previously.

The increase is capped for existing BT Sport customers meaning that even if a club's RV has gone up, the price increase will not exceed 4.9%.

In addition, BT Sport has teamed up with Google to help clubs gain expertise on building trade through social media channels.

A total of 800 customers will be able to attend a Google Digital Garage to receive special training on using social media to help boost business.

Bruce Cuthbert, Director Commercial Customers, BT Sport, said: "Our clubs can

look forward to showing the best season yet on BT Sport. We know that live sport is a key investment for our customers and we want to make sure that we help them make the most of it."

Sky Sports will be showing 126 live Premier League matches during the 2018/19 season as well as an array of other live events, including all 21 F1 races, the 2018 Ryder Cup and England's home cricket internationals.

As they did last season, Sky will use the lower of the 2010 and 2017 RVs to calculate how much a club will pay for their service but said that no club will see a rise of more than 5% to the cost of their subscription.

David Rey, Managing Director of Sky Business, said: "We are committed to investing in more of the content that matters to our customers, alongside a new range of game-changing support tools, so that Sky will continue to drive their business – both now and in the future."

Sky is launching a new website – The Training Ground – to help customers to better understand and market live sport.

# EDITOR'S LETTER

Welcome to the July edition of *Club Journal*.

As the vast majority of club officials will no doubt agree, it has been a very busy time in terms of dealing with an ever-increasing number of issues which affect our clubs.

Having recently had to contend with the new General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) and their implications for members' clubs, many of our clubs have been concerned by letters they received from the an organisation called the Motion Picture Licensing Company (MPLC).

The letter highlighted what it termed 'significant changes to the UK copyright law that will impact clubs' with the suggestion that clubs may require a MPLC licence if they show broadcast films or television in public.

Our officials have been in contact with the MPLC and made clear our position that clubs showing sports coverage, news, weather and live events have absolutely no need to purchase a costly MPLC licence.

Please see the letter on page 15 for further details on this issue and don't hesitate to get in touch with your Branch Office if you have any

further concerns or questions regarding the MPLC.

Indeed, this was one of the key talking points at the recent meeting of the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Non Profit Making Members' Clubs at Westminster which was attended by several CIU officials.

These quarterly meetings are a vital opportunity for the Union and other members' club organisations to have a dialogue with MPs and Peers and let them know how the legislation they pass affects clubs at the grass roots level.

This month's 'Club of the Month' is Knott End Working Men's Club in Poulton-le-Fylde, Lancashire, and it is another shining example of a well-run Union club which is at the heart of its community.

## Annual memorial club football match raises £6,500

A charity football match between two CIU clubs, in memory of a popular Durham woman, has raised more than £6,500.

The teams from Sacriston WMC and Langley Park WMC took part in the annual Mary Hayton Charity Football tournament at Sacriston FC to raise money for Cancer Research UK.

Mrs Hayton, of Sacriston, died of pancreatic cancer in June 2003, at the age of 42.

Following her death, her friends and family set up a memorial fund to raise money for Cancer Research UK.

Eileen Jones, her sister and the event organiser, said: "Mary worked as a manager at the University Hospital of North Durham and was much-loved in the communities of Langley Park and Sacriston."

In total, five matches took place, featuring players of all ages, with the main event being Sacriston WMC and Langley Park WMC playing for the Mary Hayton Charity Shield.

Then, in the evening, Sacriston WMC staged a special night of live entertainment as well as a quiz, raffle and bingo.

Mrs Jones, of Langley Park, said: "We had about 200 people at the football and about 300 on the night time and raised £6,500 – that's just amazing and totally unbelievable.

"It was beautiful weather and everyone turned out. The kindness of the Langley Park and Sacriston communities continues to be fantastic.

"The atmosphere was also fantastic both day and night, the band were amazing and so energetic."

Mrs Jones said the event has now raised more than £70,000 since it was first launched 15 years ago. She added: "Mary was our sister and I always say she will never be forgotten. We were only going to do this charity for ten years and it's just gone on and on because all these people come out to see the football and make it a brilliant family day."

### Memorial charity event to be held at Tindale Crescent WMC

A teenager who died of leukaemia 27 years ago will be remembered at a charity night at Tindale Crescent Working Men's Club on what would have been his 40th birthday.

Wilson Whittaker, from Bishop Auckland, was 13 when he was diagnosed with the disease and died just a week later.

His family, including his parents Wilson and Susan Whittaker and sister, Suzanne, were devastated and struggled to come to terms with what happened.

But in the year that Wilson would have turned 40, Suzanne has decided to stage a fundraising event in her son's memory.

She has organised a series of events and activities, which will culminate in an 1980s-themed charity night at Tindale Crescent WMC on Wilson's birthday, Friday, July 27.

All of the money raised will be donated to the Children's Cancer and Leukaemia Group.

Suzanne, who is the Club Manager, said: "It's something I've wanted to do for a while but I've never felt able to. It was just too upsetting for us all.

"In January, I thought about how Wilson would have turned 40 this year and it seemed the right time to do something. I know it is a long time after but we have really struggled.

"An '80s night seems the perfect thing to do as I know Wilson would have loved it. He was such a happy-go-lucky person and was the life and soul of a party."

Tickets for the fundraising night are now on sale priced at £7.

As well as the musical entertainment, there will be a raffle, featuring a host of prizes donated by local businesses. Highlights include a 32-inch television and free hot tub hire for a weekend.

**S**ituated on the Fylde coast, Knott End Working Men's Club in Poulton-le-Fylde has been open since 1924 and currently has well over 1,000 members enjoying its first-class facilities – including Lounge, Games Room, Concert Room, Beer Garden and Bowling Green – and warm, friendly atmosphere.

The club enjoys a cherished position in its local community and provides a wealth of social, sporting and cultural opportunities throughout the week for its members.

Whether it's live entertainment, great food, bowls, darts, snooker, live football on the big screen you're after – or just a quiet drink and a chat with friends – the club has everything covered.

"We want to ensure that every member who comes into the club has an enjoyable and comfortable experience," says Club President Wilfred Jones.

"We're busy throughout the week with numerous activities encouraging different groups of members to come into the club at different times."

And it's certainly a diverse array of events, kicking off on Monday afternoons with a

craft class teaching members how to make greetings cards, something which has proven so popular a second evening class has been added to the schedule.

On Tuesdays, the Whist and Dominoes club takes place in the Lounge while in the evening it's band practice on the stage of the Concert Room.

Wednesday evening is Quiz Night, with a gallon of beer on offer as an incentive for the winners, while Thursday nights offer Bingo, Open The Box, Hoy and a raffle.

On Friday evenings, the Concert Room is normally hired out for private functions, while Saturday night is the major draw for members.

"Saturday night is a big night for the club with good artists on every week," says Wilfred. "We have a late licence so we're open until midnight and we also run Bingo, Hoy and a raffle in breaks from the live entertainment.

"It's always a good night's entertainment. Our village is a bit cut off as there are no buses running at the weekend and the buses during the week finish at 7pm and that actually works to our advantage as people

know that they can have a good night out without travelling further afield."

The week is rounded off on Sunday night with what Wilfred describes as a 'relaxing evening with some bingo and bit of a music'.

The club works hard to keep prices down at the bar and offers a wide array of drinks at a good price.

"We want to encourage younger members in and that includes looking at our drinks offering to make it more appealing to them," explains Club Secretary Karen Bradford.

"As well as offering shots and cocktails, we've added a new range of bottled wines which are a good seller. We've also introduced a gin bar with a range of different gins and mixers as gin is really popular at the moment.

"Carling lager is our biggest seller but cask ale also does very well for us."

There are also regular special charity events held at the club, as Wilfred explains: "Our members really throw themselves into raising funds for good causes," he says.

"The main three charities we support are the RNLI, the local Air Ambulance Service and the Trinity Hospice and we've raised

many thousands of pounds already this year.

“I used to work for the Ambulance Service before I retired so I asked one of the Air Ambulance team to come down and give a talk to members and that really helped to give an insight into the great work they do.”

The club also has a restaurant – Conroy’s Kitchen – which is open six days a week (12pm-3pm, Tuesdays-Fridays and 12pm to 5pm, Saturdays and Sundays) and serves up tasty fare at very reasonable prices, including a ‘light bite’ menu, children’s menu and very substantial three-course meals, including roasts, fish and chips, pies and curries.

“It’s very popular with our members and having the restaurant means we can also supply food for private functions,” says Karen. “We do a buffet on Friday and Saturday nights and have been doing them for all of England’s World Cup games.”

Sport is also a big part of the club’s appeal with a newly refurbished Games Room offering two snooker tables, a pool table and darts. The club also boasts an award-winning bowling green which is regarded as one of the best playing surfaces in the North West.

Another attraction is the large projector screen with the club showing all the big matches on Sky Sports and BT Sport throughout the season.

“In the run-up to Christmas we do an indoor sports competition among the members,” says Wilfred. “It’s done on a knockout basis with cash prizes for the winners and runners-up. We run a similar competition in the spring in the build-up to

our Presidents Day – the third Saturday of July – which is the busiest day of the year for the club.

“It’s a great day for the club with loads going on. We put up a bouncy castle in our beer garden for the kids and then everyone who wants to can take part in a knockout bowls competition on the green and have a glass or two a special punch that we make especially for the occasion.

“There’s an afternoon buffet for everyone and then in the evening, in the Concert Room, there’s a presentation for all the competition winners and following that there’s live entertainment, bingo, raffles, etc. It brings the whole club together and is a real highlight of our year.”

As well as having its own thriving bowls section which competes in the local leagues, the club has become a destination for visits from other bowling clubs. “We regularly welcome large bowling parties of around 40-50 people from other parts of the country to the club,” says Karen. “They

come down on a Saturday, have lunch, play bowls on our green and then have an evening meal. .

“Many of them choose to stay on for the evening entertainment and then head back on their coach at the end of the night so it’s a great earner for the club with all the extra money that is going over the bar.

“We always give them a warm welcome and most of them immediately book up again for the next year and become regular visitors.”

Wilfred also points to the family ethos of the club. “On Fridays when there’s no private party booked, we do a children’s party with an entertainer who puts on a show for the kids,” he says.

“We’re very happy to welcome children of all ages to the club and we have the beer garden which kids can play in.

“Being near the coast, there are four caravan parks in the area so we have a number of people who come down and spend the summer here – from May until September - and become members of the club. It means the summer months are particularly busy for us.”

The club continues to invest in its facilities and recently upgraded the men’s toilets and Concert Room with the Lounge the next major area to be refurbished.

“We’re absolutely delighted with how the club is doing,” says Wilfred.

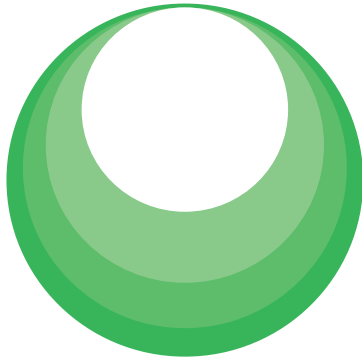

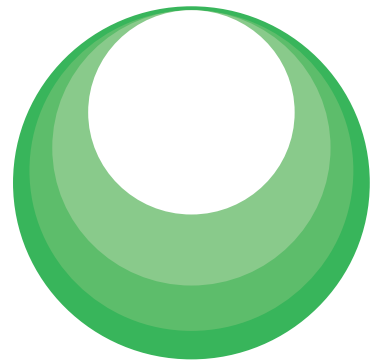

## CIU officials take part in the latest APPG



One of the key topics under discussion at the latest APPG for Non-Profit Making Members' Clubs was the MPLC Licence

The All-Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) for Non-Profit Making Members' Clubs took place on Tuesday, June 12 at the House of Commons with several members of the CIU in attendance, including President George Dawson CMD, General Secretary Kenneth D Green CMD, NEC Members Dave Gravel CMD and Bob Russell CMD, Head Office Manager Stephen Goulding, CIU Legal Consultant Allyn Walton and CIU Parliamentary Consultant Gerry Sutcliffe.

The Chairman of the meeting, Lord Smith of Hindhead CBE, the Chief Executive of the Association of Conservative Clubs (ACC), was re-elected as Joint Chairman of the Group alongside Stephen Hepburn MP.

Also re-elected was Sir David Crausby MP who will continue as the Group's Honorary Secretary.

Discussion was held on the continuing efforts to boost the number of MPs and Peers belonging to the APPG and it was agreed that further letters would be sent out to members of both Houses of Parliament inviting them to join the Group ahead of a Parliamentary Reception to be held later in the year.

Also under discussion was the recent communication received by many members' clubs from the Motion Picture Licensing Company (MPLC) regarding what the organisation termed as 'significant changes to the UK copyright law that will impact clubs' with the suggestion that clubs may require a MPLC licence if they show broadcast films or television in public.

The Union's General Secretary Kenneth D Green CMD said that his own club has

received a letter from the MPLC and that he had held a subsequent discussion with David Taylor, the Managing Director of MPLC.

The consensus at the APPG was that clubs showing sports coverage, news, weather and live events do not need a MPLC licence and that club organisations would write to their member clubs to this effect (Please see the official CIU Head Office communication regarding the MPLC Licence on the page opposite).

A further item on the agenda was the Government's Making Tax Digital (MTD) initiative which will obligate businesses to keep digital financial records.

The CIU has already submitted its response to this initiative and is seeking an exemption for its member clubs on the grounds that it will place a huge cost on clubs.

It was agreed that this argument would be re-submitted to the appropriate Government department in a letter from the APPG, signed by the Joint Chairmen.

Also on the agenda were the implications for clubs of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), the ongoing Linneweber cases and the merger between the PRS and PPL.

Under Any Other Business, Mary Glindon MP, the Member of Parliament for North Tyneside, raised the issue of vaping in clubs and whether members should be allowed to vape inside premises as a way of encouraging smokers to move towards the healthier alternative of vaping.

The date for the next quarterly APPG meeting is to be confirmed.

### **Re: Motion Picture Licencing Company (MPLC) – Demand letters & Applications for Licences**

Over recent weeks we have received enquiries from many clubs for advice regarding correspondence received from the above. We have also received written feedback from MPLC itself having forwarded complaints on clubs' behalf regarding threatened fines and incorrect information received in relation to Sports channels.

The position regarding the requirement for a licence has recently been clarified in writing by MPLC in the following terms:

*The amendment to Section 72 [Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988] does not only cover 'film', but instead it covers any creative work, which will include not only films, but also television shows.*

It has been made clear that a licence is not required for unedited sports coverage or any other TV broadcast which does not contain 'creative work'. This would arguably include (but isn't necessarily restricted to) the following:

- Sports coverage
- News
- Weather
- Live events (such as the recent marriage of Harry & Megan etc)

We have informed MPLC that the majority of clubs with television will use them solely to show sport. They have advised on the following terms:

*It is doubtful that clubs actually know what is being broadcast, and whether films or other creative work are included in the broadcast. Such works frequently come on air, and unless there is someone actively monitoring the content that is being broadcast, you cannot be certain that unlicensed works are not being broadcast and that our studio partners' rights are therefore being infringed.*

In the circumstances our advice to CIU Affiliated Club's is that providing clubs restrict their coverage to sports, news and other events as listed above, they should not need a licence from MPLC or any other similar body.

**Please note that this in no way affects the need for additional licences required to show free-to-air broadcasts in relation to music content by the collective licences provided by PRS and PPL.**

Please keep me updated if you receive any further direct contact which contrasts with this advice or your club receive a complaint or a fine for alleged copyright infringement.

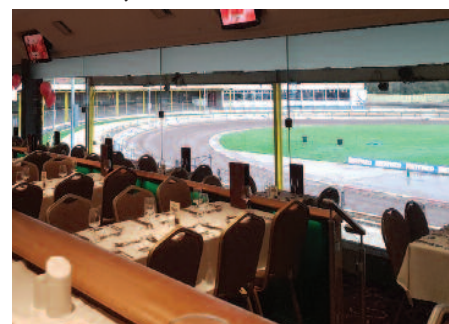

The tourist season is well and truly here in the UK with many of us getting ready for our holiday travel destinations.

If you are going abroad, it is advisable to purchase travel insurance, especially if you plan to stay in the USA.

Shop around for policies online or go to the Post Office as insurance can sometimes cost more if you purchase directly through a travel agency, tour operator or an airline.

You may already have a credit card or current account offering a travel insurance policy. However, always check to be sure the cover offered is sufficient for all your travel needs.

Policies should cover medical expenses of at least £2m for Europe or £5m worldwide with approximately £3,000 for cancellations and £1,500 for baggage.

Decide on the excess amount before you

purchase, as 'one fee' per claim can sometimes work out cheaper.

Read any policy carefully for restrictions, age limits or medical exclusions as many, particularly the cheapest, will not insure anyone aged over 65 or cover pre-existing conditions.

At present if you are heading over to Europe you can still get an application form from the post office for the free European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) to use while temporarily visiting an EU country.

If flying long distance, invest in a really good pair of headphones or earplugs to cancel out sounds and aircraft noise.

To avoid stiffness in the neck or shoulders purchase a good travel pillow. If you suffer from back pain include a lumbar cushion for the small of your back.

An inflatable cushion to raise your feet aids circulation and can reduce swelling.

If not impressed by in-flight meals why not pick up some luxury chocolates or snacks in the Duty Free before boarding to bridge that gap between Economy and First Class and make the most of your journey!

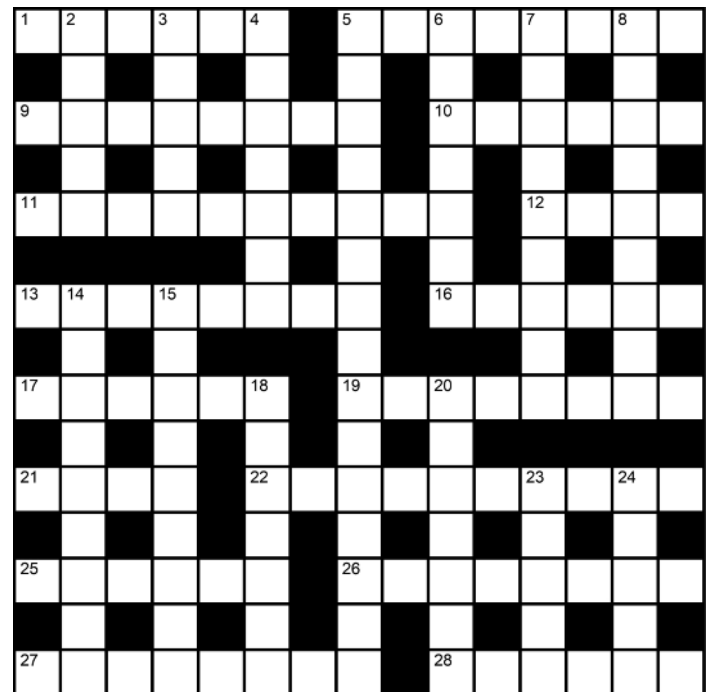

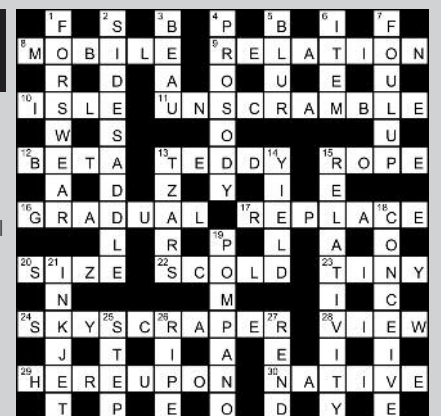
